 - College Credit Plus (CCP)
 - International Baccalaureate (IB)
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Advanced Placement (AP)

- Students participate in national curriculum approved by the College Board
 - Students receive credit based on their test scores and the school they choose to attend.
 - Testing is done in May, at a cost to students. Students receive their scores over the summer. Credit can be given for a score over 3 on a 1-5 scale.
 - All Colleges and Universities accept AP credit in some form or another as long as the score meets their criteria.
 - AP Courses are college level
 - In depth study of the subject
 - Higher level thinking
 - Opportunity to challenge yourself
 - Opportunity to earn college credit
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What is International Baccalaureate?

- A two-year program that offers juniors and seniors a challenging, college-prep curriculum
 - Hosted at Wooster High School (still a WHS student)
 - IB credits are accepted Internationally, similar to AP this is dependent on test scores at the conclusion of the course.

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What is CCP?

College Credit Plus

- College Credit Plus (CCP) allows all students in grades 7-12 to enroll full or part-time at approved public colleges, universities, or technical schools. Students must meet college entrance requirements in order to participate. Students can earn high school and college credits at the same time.
 - Students may earn up to 30 college credits per year and 120 while in the program. HS credits count towards 30.
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College Credit Plus

- Students sign up for college courses, the grade they receive in the course is on the students permanent high school transcript, counts toward graduation requirements and is also on the permanent college transcript.
 - Grades of “C” or higher may then be transferred to other colleges and universities through the Ohio Transfer Module.

 - Transfer credit is not guaranteed at private or out of state schools, but is generally accepted.
 - Students can take these courses at a partner college or university, on our high school campus or online.
 - Enrollment in CCP does not negate requirement needed for graduation: Algebra/ELA 684 or higher & 2 diploma seals.
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CCP Rules & Info

- No cost to student for tuition, books or fees.
 - Transportation for courses off the HS campus is the responsibility of the student, including parking fees.
 - Failing a college course or dropping after the drop date will result in the payment being made by the student, not WHS.
 - All paperwork in your folder is a requirement to participate.
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Eligibility

- Must complete an assessment exam and be determined “eligible”
 - The ACT is the test required by WHS - The Accuplacer is an option if applying to Stark State.
 - Admittance based on the score does not automatically qualify students for all CCP courses. For example, to take College Comp a student needs an 18 on the English portion of the ACT. They could potentially qualify for CCP based on an ACT score of 22 in Math, but not be eligible for Comp.
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College Admission:

- Review college requirements, processes, paperwork, and deadlines in your folder.
 - Colleges have the final decision on student admission.
 - If the student is admitted to the college, the college will send a “Questionnaire” that must be completed for enrollment.
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Scheduling Courses

- If taking a course within the walls of WHS you will schedule courses here @ WHS.
 - If taking courses at a college or online you must schedule with the advisor at that college.
 - Again, please keep in mind some courses require different scores than admission scores to participate.
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CCP credits

- A student must take a minimum of a full time high school schedule in order to maintain eligibility – 5 HS credits a year
 - College classes are worth a certain number of hours each, based on how long and how often they meet. These hours transfer into credits. (1-4 credits)
 - These hours are translated back to high school credits based on the following formula:
 - 3 (or 4) college credits = 1 high school credit
 - 2 college credits = .67 high school credits
 - 1 college credit = .33 high school credits
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CCP Credit Conversion

In a year, if:	Student may take up to:
No HS credit	30 college credits
1 hs only credit scheduled	27 college credits
2 hs only credits scheduled	24 college credits
3 hs only credits scheduled	21 college credits
4 hs only credits scheduled	18 college credits
5 hs only credits scheduled	15 college credits
6 hs only credits scheduled	12 college credits
7 hs only credits scheduled	9 college credits

CCP/AP Grades

CCP

- Calculated on the 4.4 scale- not weighted (students must get a C or above for CCP Credit)
- Grades given at the semester
- Athletic eligibility must meet OHSAA guidelines
- After graduation from high school, STUDENTS need to transfer college credits to another college or university. STUDENTS must contact the college office to send official transcripts. Waynedale cannot send these for students. We can only send high school credit transcripts.

AP

- Calculated on the 4.4 scale – not weighted
 - Grades given every 9 weeks (+ interims)
 - Athletic eligibility must meet OHSAA guidelines

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CCP Pros & Cons

Pros	Cons
You may be able to take courses not offered at the high school	If you fail a course you will have to pay for it
You can experience college and college level coursework	Your schedule may not work with other courses you want to take
You may be able to take courses in a particular area of interest	You may not be comfortable in classes with older students
You may earn college credits at no cost to you	You may not be academically ready or commitment ready
You may be able to be more independent in your schedule	You may miss out on things at Waynedale
May reduce course load freshman year of college	Most professors are not Waynedale High School Teachers

Mature Subject Matter

The Ohio Department of Education has required the following statement to be included in our presentation as according to section 3365.035 of the Ohio Revised Code.

"The subject matter of a course enrolled in under the college credit plus program may include mature subject matter or materials, including those of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature, that will not be modified based upon college credit plus enrollee participation regardless of where course instruction occurs."

Application Info

College Admittance Exams

- Sign up to take the ACT (final test date: Feb 12, 2022) at act.org
- Juniors will take the ACT on March 1 at WHS (for free).
- Accuplacer tests must be arranged with Stark State.
- Keep in mind some courses require higher scores for placement.

Applying

- Students will apply in March once ACT or Accuplacer scores are in. Please give your student their social security number – they must have it to apply. WHS deadline to apply is April 1 (the same day paperwork has to be submitted to the State) Folder is due March 25.

Before scheduling college courses on your WHS schedule you must be enrolled and accepted at the college. Students typically complete a schedule with & without CCP courses

Making the Decision

- Consider the Pros and Cons list
 - Do you qualify?
 - Is CCP in line with your future plans?
 - Are you independent and self motivated to meet deadlines and follow directions?
 - Are you ready for college level work and the extra time and commitment it will take?
 - Are you self-disciplined and able to ask for help when needed? Professors expect you to self-advocate, not your parents.
 - Do you have transportation and are you able to drive in all weather types?
 - Will you have time for all your commitments: band, sports, clubs, work, etc
 - If you are part time at the college and high school can you get the schedule you need?
 - Are you comfortable taking more difficult course work with the potential to affect your GPA?

- Accuplacer - 250 Reading, 263 Writing OR 263 Math QAS (must take with AU)
- **and** 2.5 GPA

Mandatory Requirements:

- **Minimum 18 ACT English score**

Preferred Requirements:

- **3.0** cumulative GPA
- **21 ACT** composite, or **1060 SAT** combined Math & Evidence-Based Reading and Writing
 - *Admissions staff will evaluate the cumulative GPA and ACT/SAT scores to determine college readiness for applicants not meeting the preferred requirements.*

**Eligibility requirements are subject to change.*

How to Apply:

- Online at wayne.uakron.edu/admissions
 - Print and submit the CCP Signature Page
 - Submit Official High School Transcripts
 - Submit ACT/SAT scores
 - *(testing must be completed prior to application deadlines)**
- Application Deadlines**
 - Summer and Fall Semesters: April 15

OHIO STATE ATI -WOOSTER

- **The Academy Program**
 - Requirement for Unconditional Admission (Ohio's remediation-free guidelines):
 - ACT English score of 18
 - ACT Reading score of 22
 - ACT Math score of 22
 - OR equivalent SAT or ACCUPLACER* scores as outlined in the chart below.

READINESS AREA	ACT	SAT	NEXT GENERATION ACCUPLACER*
English Sub Score	18	Evidence Based Reading & Writing: 480	Writing: 263 or above OR 5 on WritePlacer
Reading Sub Score	22		Reading: 250 or above
Mathematics Sub Score	22	530	Math QAS / AAF: 263 above

- *Placement testing may also be required during the pre-enrollment process.*
- * We cannot accept ACCUPLACER test results from any institution except Ohio State University. Contact the Ohio State ATI testing center at (330) 287-1258 if you have taken no standardized tests previously, or the OSU Mansfield testing center at (419) 755-4133 if you have already taken an ACT, SAT, or ACCUPLACER.

Stark State - CCP
