



**NOTICE OF QUARANTINE**

The Health Commissioner (“the Commissioner”) has reason to believe that you have come in contact with a person who has Covid-19 and you may have or develop this disease. If you were to have this disease you would pose a substantial threat to the health of the public. To prevent transmission of this contagious disease, you should quarantine yourself. The location where you are to be quarantined is your home/place of residence. The Commissioner considers this the least restrictive clinically appropriate place of quarantine given the nature of the disease.

If this exposure occurred in a K-12 classroom setting, you may continue to attend school at the discretion of the school district IF you wear a mask for 10 days and you remain symptom free. Quarantine may end after you have a negative proctored COVID test (PCR or antigen) no sooner than day 5. You still will wear a mask through day 10.

If this exposure occurred in a K-12 classroom setting, you can continue to participate in school based extracurricular activities at the discretion of the school district IF you must wear a mask when possible (not during play), a negative proctored Covid test (PCR or antigen) immediately following your identification, a second negative proctored Covid test (PCR or antigen) test between day 5 and 7 of quarantine. This would also end quarantine if the tests are negative. However, you will still be required to wear a mask through day 10.

Your last date of contact has been reported as \_\_\_\_\_. The first day of quarantine starts the next day. A quarantine of at least 5 days with masking up to 10 days with no symptoms has been recommended and released by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Ohio Department of Health.

Regardless of the length of the quarantine period, you should wear a mask and monitor symptoms for 10 days. Testing during quarantine is recommended, if available. If you should develop symptoms during the 10 days, you should follow up with a healthcare provider and isolate at home.
