

# **School Parental Involvement Plan**

## **Fredericksburg Elementary**

### **2018-2019**

- 1. Fredericksburg Elementary has jointly developed with, and distributed to, parents a written parent involvement plan. This includes how parents will participate in an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the parent involvement program.** Fredericksburg Elementary School parents are invited to the Parental Involvement Plan Meeting which takes place at the Fall Make-It Take-It. Together they develop strategies for both the continuous improvement plan and the school-wide Title I Plan. These plans are available in the school office.
  
- 2. Fredericksburg Elementary has designed strategies to involve parents in the planning, review, and improvement of school programs and the education of their children.** Throughout the year, parent comments are encouraged through parent home and school communication, and daily folders or planners. Parents also have the opportunity in the spring for input through the Parent Needs Assessment/Evaluation Form. Home/school communication is encouraged at all times.
  
- 3. Fredericksburg Elementary will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I Schoolwide Program.** The school will invite all parents to a Title 1 informational meeting in the fall. The event will include information on the school's participation in Title 1, Make-it Take-it activities and district academic nights. A copy of the Parental Involvement Plan and School Improvement Plan are located in the Office so that parents will have access to the plans.
  
- 4. Fredericksburg Elementary has a Family-School Agreement that describes and outlines a partnership for sharing the responsibility for improved student achievement.** The Teacher/Parent/Student Compact is signed by all participants. This is completed at Open House or at Parent Teacher conferences.
  
- 5. Fredericksburg Elementary will provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children.** Teachers conduct a parent conference with each student's family. RTI and IEP meetings are scheduled as necessary. Progress reports are sent three times a year, report cards four times per year, and other student progress communication through a variety of means such as daily planners and parent notes.
  
- 6. Fredericksburg Elementary provides information to parents concerning State Assessments, school performance profiles, and their child's individual assessment results, including assistance in understanding the results.** Mid term progress and report cards with accompanying explanations/comments/resources are sent home on a quarterly basis for all students. Additional school reports and information is available in the district newsletter for the district and specific to our school. State testing results for students in grades 3-6 are mailed to parents in the summer. Parents of 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students receive Terra Nova and Inview results. Additionally, parents of every student are encouraged to attend individual conferences with the teachers of their child(ren) at which curriculum, assessment, and student progress is discussed.
  
- 7. Fredericksburg Elementary will notify parents by letter when their child has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.**

8. **Fredericksburg Elementary provides assistance to parents in understanding a variety of topics such as:** the state's academic content standards, the state's student academic achievement standards, the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments, the requirements of Part A, how to monitor their child's progress, and how to work with educators. Information and assistance are provided during parent teacher conferences.
9. **Fredericksburg Elementary provides materials and training for parents to help them work with their child to improve achievement.** Training to help parents work with their children is provided through a variety of means. There are Make-it Take-it workshops, parent workshops, parent teacher conferences, and phone conferences. Teachers provide information and strategies to use at home with students.
10. **Fredericksburg Elementary provides staff with appropriate education in how to work with parents as equal partners.** Parent involvement training is included in staff meeting(s). Volunteers possess enormous talent and are used as important partners at Fredericksburg.
11. **Fredericksburg Elementary conducts a variety of activities that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children.** The school provides opportunities for parents to assist at school, volunteer, or participate in classroom/school activities. Fredericksburg Elementary School has a dynamic volunteer program. Parents are welcome and encouraged to participate and assist in classroom and school wide activities.
12. **Fredericksburg Elementary provides information to parents relating to the school and parent programs, meetings, and other school activities in an understandable format.** The Principal sends out a Welcome Back to school letter as well as monthly newsletters. Information about the gifted program, RTI, and IEP meetings are also sent home to parents.
